The Prout Alliance Steering Committee has worked consistently and diligently for the past six months. We have legally incorporated Prout Alliance and we have received our Federal Tax ID number for the organization. We are working on opening up a bank account. We will soon be initiating the process for securing 501c3 status for PA. We have created a database system using WildApricot that helps us manage membership information, annual dues and donor history, event planning and volunteer engagement as well as increase our transparency. Our website is integrated with WildApricot and our future bank account will also be linked to our new database. We are committed to sending out an update every quarter to all of our membership regarding the progress of our working groups.

Good News Report

PROUT RESEARCH INSTITUTE (PRI):

In 1988 Prabhat Ranjan Sarkar gave instructions that a Prout Research Institute should be established in each country to study how the Progressive Utilization Theory (Prout) can be translated into practical policies to address current crises and to educate people about this. The Prout Research Institute, Inc. is now a legal nonprofit corporation in North Carolina. It is located on the campus of the Neohumanist College of Asheville and registered at the future location of the building: PRI, 272 Wellness Way, Marshall, NC 28753-0763. We have opened a bank account in the local credit union. Our Board of Directors has met: Shriraksha Mohan (Oregon), Vicepresident Jody Wright (Didi Devanistha, Massachussetts), Craig Runde (Candrashekhara, Florida), Treasurer Howard Nemon (Hiranmaya, North Carolina), Michael Zimmerman (Pranava, Tennessee), Secretary Mark Friedman (Mahadeva, California), and President Dada Maheshvarananda. We have applied for 501(c)(3) nonprofit status with the IRS. Until it is approved, donations requiring a tax exempt receipt can be made to the Neohumanist College of Asheville (connected to Benevity).

A larger Advisory Committee is being formed of other Proutists who will advise and contribute to the PRI's vision and programs.

One acre has been cleared. The sanitation permit has been approved by the county inspector. The French Broad Electric Company is installing a line to the site, and a water pipe will be laid from the college well. The road has been widened and covered with fresh gravel. Anasuya has completed the architectural plan and a civil engineer has made the foundation plan. Solar panels and a geothermal heating and cooling pump will be installed. Attached are the pictures of the complete building and the smaller design for the first stage. Prout Alliance Treasurer's Report:

The Steering Committee (SC) Report in this premier edition of the "PA Connection", mentioned acquiring WildApricot to build a strong base for PA for the long term. It provides many useful support functions, such as tracking membership renewals and also making it easy for new people to join PA

(addressed by PA Membership Committee) or for supporters to donate to PA to further its vitally important work. Since some member anniversary dates are coming up in March, a few of you will be receiving reminders, so thank you for renewing your PA membership in a timely manner, and if you have the capacity – additional contributions to support PA would also be much appreciated. If paying dues poses a financial challenge, then a waiver request can be sent to the SC (steering@proutalliance.org).

In 2021 PA was fortunate to have a matching fund membership campaign. Having enjoyed great success last year, it will be repeated this year in conjunction with the ambitious membership drive PAx2-10/22 - to double 2021 Membership of 29 to 58 people by the Annual Mtg in October 2022. All donations to PA made during the 3/1-9/30/22 period will be matched dollar for dollar up to \$1,500.00 (to be funded in \$500.00 increments) - so please take advantage of that opportunity to double your PA contribution. PAx2-10/22 and fund matching progress reports will be shared periodically. Most importantly, encourage others you know to join PA and help make a difference in the course of Human Society.

PA is applying for IRS 501c3 certification and opening a bank account so it can manage its own financial affairs. When that is established, then PA will thank the Prama Institute (PI) and its Board of Directors for providing PA donors with a Fed tax exemption option. In addition to that sponsorship, Howard Nemon also provided key accounting and financial support functions for PA during the critical last couple of years as PA was evolving to become fully independent. So, a very big Thank You! To PI and its supportive Board and to Mr Nemon for your critical support these last two years!

De rigueur with Treasurer Reports is - of course, a reference to the numbers! PA ended 2021 with a balance of \$4,113.36. As of 2/18/22: 1/1/22 Balance forward of \$4.113.36 plus Income of \$0.00 (dues renewals start in March) less Expenses \$1,334.00 left a balance of \$2,779.36. Pending expenses totaling \$535 will reduce the available funds to \$2,244.36. Details follow.

Membership Committee Report:

The PA Membership Committee has been meeting monthly since November, 2021. Its members consist of Hiranmaya, Shriraksha, Ananta, Prakash, and Suprabhata. The committee initially worked to standardize the membership application. However, given the membership requirements that had been approved by the General Assembly, they realized that it would be helpful to establish two tiers of membership - supporting and active. The former would make a small yearly membership contribution, fill out a simple, sign-up form, and receive materials and supports to help them understand better Prout and how they can get involved. The active members would contribute annual fees, have voting rights, and participate in organizational work through committees and teams.

In recent meetings, the membership committee has become familiar with Wild Apricot, which is the software that PA has adopted for membership management. They are also developing a list of benefits for both types of members and compiling resources to be shared with new members. For this purpose, they hope to collaborate with PA's Educational Materials Team and the Education Team.


Spiritually Speaking
